






## Royce at his home with a model of his F9F Panther and artwork depicting the same airplane

This particular piece of paper contains the names of the Soviet pilots he shot down on November 18, 1952. Royce carries this piece of paper with him as an honor to these pilots' service and their memory. Royce believes peace is far better than war and is grateful to have had the chance to serve his country during a difficult time and live to tell others about it.
